A quick rundown on our collections:

Save our Graves.

The operator of Sydney's Catholic cemeteries welcomed a backflip by the NSW government on its decision to dismantle and amalgamate it with



four underperforming cemetery trusts.

All were issues that were either not applicable to or were being addressed by the Catholic trust, including through its new cemeteries planned at Varroville and Wallacia.

"It just doesn't make sense to unwind the one trust that is recognised across Australia as the best performing, and the only one in Sydney that has a fully-funded perpetual care fund," Mr Casey told *The Catholic Weekly*.

"I think it's disappointing the minister has cut us out of consultation and has discounted the other two options without explanation."

"There are wonderful people who have served this ministry in many ways and they've lived with a period of uncertainty for long enough."

"It's time to provide the certainty they need so they can continue their great work of respectfully caring for the sacred remains of loved ones and helping support those who are grieving."



The Devotion of the Sacred Heart of Jesus by St Pope John Paul II

"Heart of Jesus, fount of life and holiness, have mercy on us." (Litany)

Thus, we invoke Jesus in the Litany. Everything that God wanted to tell us about himself and about his love he placed in the heart of Jesus, and by means of that heart he has told us everything. We find ourselves before an inscrutable mystery. In Jesus' Heart we read the eternal divine plan of the world's salvation. It is a plan of love...Brothers and sisters, meditating on God's love, revealed in the heart of his Son, requires a consistent response on our part. We have not been called only to contemplate the mystery of Christ's love, but take part in it. Christ says: "If you love me, you will keep my commandments" (Jn 14:15) He thus places before us a great calling and at the same time a condition: if you want to love me, keep my commandments, keep God's holy law, walk in the way that I have shown you. God's will is that we keep the commandments, that is, the law of God given to Israel on Mount Sinai through Moses. Given to all people everywhere. We know the commandments...let us repeat them now, as they are found in the Book of Exodus, to confirm and renew what we remember:



"I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage. You shall have no other gods before me.

You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.

Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy.

Honour your father and your mother, that your days may be long in the land which the Lord you God give you.

You shall not kill.

You shall not commit adultery.

You shall not steal.

You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

You shall not covet your neighbor's house.

You shall not covet your neighbor's wife." (cf. Ex 20: 2-17)

This is the foundation of the morality given to man by the Creator: The Decalogue...the Creator who at the same time is the supreme law-giver, has inscribed on the human heart the whole order of truth. This order determines what is good, provides a foundation for the moral order and constitutes the basis of the dignity of man created in God's image... Let us contemplate the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which is the source of life, since by means of it victory over death was achieved. It is also the source of holiness, since in it sin - the enemy of man's spiritual development - is defeated. The Heart of the Lord Jesus is the starting-point of the holiness of each one of us. From the Heart of the Lord Jesus let us learn the love of God and understanding of the mystery of sin- mysterium iniquitatis. Let us make acts of reparation to the Divine Heart for the sins committed by us and by our fellow men. Let us make reparation for rejecting God's goodness and love... Heart of Jesus, burning flame of love, Heart of Jesus, fount of life and holiness, Heart of Jesus, expiation for our sins - have mercy on us. Amen.
