UPDATE ON CHURCH RE-OPENING.

First of all I just want to say that I hope you are all doing well and that the blessings of God continue to be upon you.

It has been a long time since we have been able to celebrate Mass in our church and now we are getting closer to be able to resume again the worship of our God and to experience the love of the community.

So with this, we want to let you all know what's going to happen. Even though the 70% double dose gives us the opportunity to say Mass, the Archbishop has decided to wait until we reach 80% fully vaccinated, before reopening our churches to everybody. Also the priests have to be fully vaccinated and Fr Roberto will be receiving his second dose in a couple of week's times. So when all the above occurs, we will re-commence our celebrations at the usual times and the usual days with the following restrictions:

- 4 square metre rule will apply and allow us to bring into our church 85 people.
- Masks **MUST** be worn unless you have a medical exception.
- People who attend the church should ensure they are healthy and well.
- Social distancing both before and after Mass is essential.
- QR codes are still mandated and essential to enter the church.

Everyone will be welcome whether you have the vaccines or not. But if any of you feel anxious, you are most welcome to delay your return to Mass until you feel safe or until the 1st of December when 90% of the population will be vaccinated and masks won't be required. (Although masks will always be an option for added protection.)

This is our plan, but please remember that anything can happen and all this can change if necessary.
