A reading from the Acts of the Apostles It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and ourselves not to burden you beyond what is essential.

Some men came down from Judaea and taught the brothers, 'Unless you have yourselves circumcised in the tradition of Moses you cannot be saved.' This led to disagreement, and after Paul and Barnabas had a long argument with these men it was arranged that Paul and Barnabas and others of the church should go up to Jerusalem and discuss the problem with the apostles and elders.

Then the apostles and elders decided to choose delegates to send to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas; the whole church concurred with this. They chose Judas known as Barsabbas and Silas, both leading men in the brotherhood, and gave them this letter to take with them:

'The apostles and elders, your brothers, send greetings to the brothers of pagan birth in Antioch, Syria and Cilicia. We hear that some of our members have disturbed you with their demands and have unsettled your minds. They acted without any

authority from us, and so we have decided unanimously to elect delegates and to send them to you with Barnabas and Paul, men we highly respect who have dedicated their lives to the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Accordingly we are sending you Judas and Silas, who will confirm by word of mouth what we have written in this letter. It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and by ourselves not to saddle you with any burden beyond these essentials: you are to abstain from food sacrificed to idols, from blood, from the meat of strangled animals and from fornication. Avoid these, and you will do what is right. Farewell.'



Community Partnership Building grant.

The NSW Government is investing in infrastructure projects that deliver positive social, environmental, and recreational outcomes, while also promoting community participation, inclusion and cohesion. In 2022, there is a maximum of \$400,000 to allocate in each electorate. Incorporated not-forprofit community organisations and local councils are eligible to apply for grants. The average grant

awarded is around \$20,000. As total funding will be divided equally among the state electorates of NSW, applications will be assessed against other proposed

projects within the same electorate. We are hopeful that if we lodge an application we could fund a project of solar panel with batteries for our parish.

We have been contemplating the possibility of proposing this project for the parish and during this past week Fr Roberto, Vern Keyser and Gayle White met with Margaret Lee (a representative from Victor Dominello's office) and Lydia Scuglia. The panels and battery would be for the presbytery due to our aging church roof issues.

Such a project would be great for the parish by reducing our energy costs. With this in mind we will be obtaining some quotes next week to enable us to lodge our application within the very strict timeframe for the grant. We will know sometime in December if we have been lucky enough to receive the money and to go ahead with the project.



Our Lady, Help of Christians

The feast day of Mary Help of Christians has been celebrated in Australia since 1844 but the history to this day dates back to the start of the 1800s.

When Pope Pius VII was





elected he too was jailed by Bonaparte, who kept him prisoner at Fontainbleau, France.

The Holy Father vowed to God that if he were restored to the Roman See, he would institute a special feast in honour of Mary.

The military eventually forced Bonaparte to release the Pope and on May 24, 1814, Pius VII returned in triumph to Rome.

Twelve months later the Pope decreed that the feast of Mary Help of Christians be kept on 24 May.

The infant Church in Australia had a special reason for turning to Mary. In those early and mostly priestless days, it was largely the Rosary that kept the faith alive.

Catholic Australia remained faithful to Mary, and was the first nation to choose her, under the title of Help of Christians, as Principal Patron.
