A reading from the prophet Jeremiah You bore me to be a man of strife for the whole world.

and shall trust in the Lord. Response.



The Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary.



Mass will be held here at

St Therese
this Monday for the
Feast of the Assumption of Mary
at 9.30am.

Everyone is welcome to attend.

The Catholic Church sees proof of the Assumption in the Scriptures. We see in all of passages, Mary's perfect union with Jesus's destiny as the Saviour. This perfect union is evident from the birth of Jesus to after His death, as seen in: Mary's miraculous conception of Jesus announced by the Angel, Mary's accelerating his hour during His first miracle at Cana, Mary's witness to her Son's crucifixion, standing there at the foot of the cross and Mary's presence and prayers at Pentecost after Jesus's Ascension. For these reasons, the Catholic Church explains that Mary's union with Jesus requires a continuation after death, meaning that as Jesus entered Heaven with his body and soul, so did His mother.

966 "Finally the Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death." The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son's Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians:

"In giving birth you kept your virginity; in your Dormition you did not leave the world, O Mother of God, but were joined to the source of Life. You conceived the living God and, by your prayers, will deliver our souls from death."

(Byzantine liturgy) FROM THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH
