- Maintenance issues City of Ryde have confirmed that our stormwater pit and new pipe to Blaxland Road are working well.


## Fr Simon Apablaza is coming to Denistone.

## St Benedict

On the 11th of July will be the memorial of St Benedict who founded 12 communities of monks at Subiaco in Italy. Benedict to Monte travelled where Cassino



established a monastery and wrote 'The Rule'. It is a simple set of guidelines for how the life of a monk should be lived and has become one of the most influential works in all of Western Christendom. Following the golden rule of Ora et Labora (pray and work) the monks devote 8 hours to prayer, 8 hours to sleep and 8 hours to manual work, sacred reading and works of charity every day.

The medal of St Benedict is a famous one and contains an inscription of exorcism against Satan, a prayer for strength in time of temptation, for peace and among the nations and the world, a prayer that the cross be our light and guide, a prayer of firm rejection of all that is evil and petition that we may walk in God's way with the Gospel as our guide. Benedict is the patron saint of Europe.
